<b>General impression</b> Please describe your stay in 4-5 sentences	Studying at University of Lucern was a great experience, I had the opportunity to take classes of different subjects and experience other learning methods.. Getting used to the habits and lifestyle of the Swiss people was also challenging in a good way.
<b>Entry/ arrival in Switzerland</b> Immigration formalities, visa	Immigration formalities and visa were fine before I got in Switzerland, but it wasn't clear about all the fees I would have to pay. Also the resident card took so long to get ready that was useless.

My contact with other students was a little impaired because I lived in the building of Swiss students which are less friendly than the international studentes.
