<b>Searching for rooms/ accommodation</b> Experiences and useful addresses	The University of Lucerne can help you arrange accommodation in a student dormitory. I had a recommendation from somebody who already had been here and therefore I knew that I wanted to live in the Eichhof dormitory and I was satisfied with my choice.
<b>Public transportation</b> Train, bus, accessibility of university buildings	Public transport works very well in Lucerne but I actually didn't use it so much as I was living in the Eichhof dormitory and the university building is within walking distance from there.
<b>Prearrangements</b> Registration for courses, language tests, academic records	There were not too many documents needed from the university and also no language test. Registration for courses was possible after arrival in Lucerne and the process was quite easy.
<b>Information on the university</b> Location, size, infrastructure	The university building is in the city center, right next to the train station which is a perfect location. There are a couple of supermarkets and post office nearby. The university building is new and very nice.

<b>Studying at the university</b> Content of lectures, credits, assessments	The lectures that I attended were all very well structured and well prepared and I liked that there was mostly a good ratio of going through the information and discussions about it.

Every time I needed help with something or just to get information that was no problem. They were all really very nice and helpful. The swiss students who were mentors also helped us if we had some questions and they organized events for us which I enjoyed very much.
<b>Budgeting</b> Living costs, study material, money transfer	The costs of living in Switzerland are generally quite high, especially the accommodation. The prices of study material were also higher but you can find a lot of material also in the library, so it is not necessary to buy all of them. I didn't open a bank account in Switzerland. I used a credit card from my home country and there was no problem with that as you can pay almost everywhere with a credit card

Apart from that there is a lot to do and see in Lucerne and nearby. You can go hiking in the mountains or if you take the train you can visit some other cities. The only downside is the cost of transportation in Switzerland, but you can sometimes find tickets for discounted prices.</p>
