The successful candidate is expected to conduct research within the Swiss National Science Foundation-funded project “ACCORds: Advancing Configurational Comparative Research Methods”, led by Prof. Dr. Alrik Thiem. ACCORds focuses on the development and application of configurational comparative methods (also sometimes called set-theoretic methods) such as Qualitative Comparative Analysis (QCA). Specific areas of activity within ACCORds include, but are not limited to, functional and technical enhancements, mixed-method research, philosophical questions related to configurational research, and software development.
